Homebound Delivery Service Policy

The Oscar Grady Public Library's Homebound Delivery Program brings library materials on a bi-monthly basis to residents of the Village of Saukville and surrounding areas who are unable to leave their home due to a permanent condition, or a temporary condition that will last for six weeks or more. Library staff selects books, in original print format, large print, or audio book format, according to the preferences of the homebound library user.

To qualify for the service of delivery, patrons must reside within the Village of Saukville or surrounding service area, have a valid library card, meet the terms of the program and qualify for the service by matching the definition of homebound, as defined by the Ozaukee County Department of Social Services. This definition is as follows:

Residents are to be considered homebound if they have a condition (due to illness or injury) that restricts their ability to leave their place of residence, except with the aid of a supportive device such as crutches, canes, wheelchairs, and walkers, the use of special transportation, the assistance of another person or if leaving home is medically contraindicated. In most circumstances, if a resident drives, he/she would not be considered homebound.

Patrons, who wish to participate but do not want their materials delivered, may receive the service available for pickup at the Oscar Grady Public Library by a designated friend or family member, provided they have a library card valid for use within the Monarch Library System and meet the requirements as defined.

Patrons who participate in the Homebound Program must agree to allow the Library to maintain a Reading History Log for the sole purpose of avoiding duplication of materials and circulation. The Reading History Log will only be used for internal purposes and will not be shared publically.

The Library has the right to restrict the format and any titles requested based on availability and to terminate this service to any individual who does not meet the requirements as defined above.
